Frequently Asked Questions

How many intern positions are there?

There will be 45 full-time intern positions for 2025.

How many intern places will Barwon Health offer in the Victorian Rural Preferential Allocation (VRPA) round and the metro round? Should applicants apply for both?

The Postgraduate Medical Council of Victoria (PMCV) are responsible for the match process and can advise how this will run. We are very excited to be part of both the VRPA and metro match as we offer career opportunities for both metropolitan and rural junior doctors. We encourage you to only apply for the health services that you really want to come to and continue to refer to the PMCV website and their VRPA session as your source of information. How many Priority Group 2 and 3 students did Barwon Health accept in previous years, and how many will you be accepting this year?

We work within the PMCV guidelines. We have been able to offer positions to international students and those from interstate. The number will vary from year to year.

What is your typical intake ratio of Deakin University to non-Deakin graduates? I completed my training at another university, does this affect my application? The ratio varies from year to year. We have doctors from all universities in our intern group. We are interested in doctors who want to learn, work and stay at Barwon Health.

Will Barwon Health consider paired applications?

Paired applications are welcome. The request to be considered as a paired application needs to be clearly **identified in both applicants' cover** letters. Ranking will be the average of both applicants.

I am interested in part-time internship.

Barwon Health can offer part-time internship which will be completed over two years. Please discuss your individual needs with PMCV and our Director Medical Workforce Unit prior to submitting your application.

How do I apply for an intern position at Barwon Health?

Applications **must** be made to PMCV and to Barwon Health via the online recruitment system.

What do I have to include in my application?

Your application should include:

- Responses to Key Selection Criteria questions
- Curriculum Vitae (use standardised PMCV template with passport photo)

Is there a page/word limit for the cover letter and CV?

We recommend you keep both documents succinct, clearly communicating the required information. Your cover letter should be no longer than one page.

Will there be a face-to-face interview in addition to the PMCV pre-recorded interview?

No, there will be no additional interviews.

What references do you require? e.g. Consultant or registrar; would you prefer references from your hospital; will you accept non-clinical references; how recent do they need to be?

References should be completed by someone who knows you in the clinical environment and can provide comments. We recommend references are provided by Consultants or Fellows who have supervised you in the past 12 months. Non-clinical references are not accepted. What criteria will Barwon Health be using for selecting interns for 2025?

Barwon Health will use the following information to assess your application:

- Cover letter
- Curriculum vitae (PMCV template)
- References (PMCV template)
- Responses to key selection questions
- Online interview performance

What is the education program for internship?

There is a dedicated one-week Intern
Orientation program, which includes simulation
training on managing the deteriorating patient,
clinical skills workshops, and preparedness for
clinical practice primers (i.e. clinical handovers,
clinical documentation, clinical software use
and wellbeing).

Weekly intern tutorials and Grand Rounds occur with lunch provided. More specialised weekly tutorial programs for junior doctors occur in Emergency, Rehabilitation and Aged Care, and Psychiatry. Ward based deteriorating patient simulations are scheduled throughout the year.

In addition to the formal programs, Junior Medical Staff have opportunities to participate in Clinical Unit teaching, Journal Clubs, and Deakin Medical School Simulation sessions.

I'm interested in research - what opportunities do you have at Barwon Health?

Junior Medical Staff are encouraged to join active research and audit projects within your Clinical Directorates. If you are interested in a more formal research experience, Barwon Health offers countless opportunities in partnership with Deakin University, including a Masters in Surgical Research or a PhD within world-renowned Research Centres such as IMPACT (Institute for Mental and Physical Health and Clinical Translation) or GCEID (Geelong Centre for Emerging Infectious Diseases).

There are a lot of unique rotation opportunities in internship at Barwon Health in and around the Barwon South West Region. Will I need a car?

Yes, it is highly recommended that you have a valid driver's licence and access to private transport.

Following internship, what are the training and career opportunities at Barwon Health?

Barwon Health offers a wide range of prevocational and vocational training positions to support career progression. The prevocational training streams are carefully designed to provide the necessary experience and opportunities to help with successful Specialist College entry applications and career development. Details of these are found in our Intern program booklet.

Critical care, a popular prevocational training pathway is offered in Post Graduate Year (PGY) 3 along with the Diploma of Obstetrics and the Emergency Medicine Certificate. Opportunity to complete a certificate of Women's Health is offered in PGY 2 and 3.

In PGY 2 you can commence Basic Physician Training or the PGY 2 Program aligned with the new National Framework for Prevocational Medical Training.

The PGY 2 Program provides a broad range of opportunities including possible rotations in Paediatrics, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Speciality Surgery, Speciality Medicine, Adult and Paediatric Emergency Medicine and Psychiatry. Emergency Medicine rotations are accredited for the paediatric component of GP training.

Many of our senior medical staff have themselves trained at Barwon Health and are passionate about the health service, mentoring our junior staff, and the lifestyle that comes with working in a regional centre.

What if I'm not matched to Barwon Health for my internship?

We encourage you to consider reapplying for Barwon Health as you develop your medical

career. Re-join us for a PGY 2/3 position in BPT1, PGY 2 Program, or our Surgical, General or Critical Care streams.
