The Aboriginal Workforce Officer (AWO) provides support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants and employees, understanding that a strong indigenous workforce will help Barwon Health provide better quality health outcomes to the community.

The AWO can provide cultural support to managers who have Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander employees within their departments.
